

## How the UKCAT is used by Consortium Universities (2018 Entry)

This is an overview of how each Consortium University uses the UKCAT in their admissions processes. We try to provide up to date information *directly copied* from their website on the date cited but cannot be held responsible for any omissions, inaccuracies or changes. At this point in the year some information could still relate to 2017 entry so we recommend you check the website links provided before making any decisions regarding your application for 2018 entry.

### ***Important information on 2017 UKCAT scores***

In 2017 the Decision Making subtest will be a scored part of the UKCAT. As a result, scores will range between 1200 and 3600. Decision Making is a new subtest and candidate performance may vary to that observed in Decision Analysis which it has replaced.

As a result, average scores in 2017 may vary to those observed in previous years. UKCAT will issue interim score statistics in mid-September 2017 and final test statistics in early October 2017. If following testing, candidates are unsure about how they have performed in relation to other candidates they may wish to wait until they have had sight of these scores before submitting their application.

In order to help them make their University choices, candidates will want to understand how their 2017 test result relates to those used by Universities in previous years. This will be of particular interest to those wishing to apply to Universities who apply a threshold score.
