

How the UKCAT is used by Consortium Universities (2019 Entry)

This is an overview of how each Consortium University uses the UKCAT in their admissions processes. We try to provide up to date information directly copied from their website on the date cited but cannot be held responsible for any omissions, inaccuracies or changes. At this point in the year some information could still relate to 2018 entry so we recommend you check the website links provided before making any decisions regarding your application for 2019 entry.

Important information on 2018 UKCAT scores

UKCAT will issue interim score statistics in mid-September 2018 and final test statistics in early October 2018 once testing has ended. If you are unsure about how you have performed in relation to other candidates, you may wish to wait until you have had sight of these scores before submitting your application.

In order to help you make your University choices, you will want to understand how your 2018 test result relates to those used by Universities in previous years. This will be of particular interest to those wishing to apply to Universities who apply a threshold score.
